



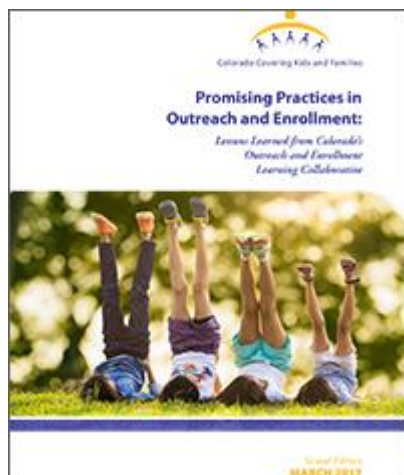

- Collaborate with community partners
- Co-locate programs/services
- Create an outreach and enrollment work plan to guide your work
- Hire or cultivate relationships with individuals who are already trusted members of the communities you want to reach
- Use data to find the eligible but not enrolled
