



Bold Breakthroughs: Shaping Narratives in Shifting Times

Getting to the Heart of the Matter with Dr. Tiffany Manuel

Recognizing this, The Colorado Health Foundation community recently engaged in a powerful *At the Heart of the Matter* online discussion entitled, **Bold Breakthroughs: Shaping Narratives in Shifting Times**. A compelling dialogue between Dr. Tiffany Manuel and Foundation CEO Karen McNeil-Miller, this conversation served as a follow-up to Dr. Manuel's impactful mainstage talk at [last summer's Colorado Health Symposium](#), where she explored the role of strategic storytelling in advancing equity.

The Power of Engagement and Storytelling

Dr. Manuel emphasized that engagement and storytelling are foundational to advancing equity. She noted that narratives are not merely comprised of stories we tell but are "strategic tools that can mobilize communities and catalyze change." By authentically engaging with communities and understanding their unique experiences, leaders can craft compelling narratives that resonate deeply and inspire action. She reminded us that "narratives should help people see themselves as part of the solution rather than just observers of the problem." This approach transforms passive listeners into active participants in the movement toward equity.

Embracing Joy in Advocacy

Amidst the challenges inherent in equity work, Dr. Manuel highlighted the importance of embracing joy. "Joy is a form of resistance and resilience," she explained, serving as a counterbalance to the often heavy nature of social justice endeavors. "If we only focus on what's broken, we'll miss the powerful ways people are already leading change in their communities." By infusing joy into advocacy, leaders can sustain momentum, foster stronger connections within communities, and create a more inviting space for others to join the cause.

Navigating a Shifting Political Landscape

The discussion also addressed the complexities of operating within a shifting political landscape. Dr. Manuel advised leaders to remain adaptable and forward-thinking, recognizing that while policies and administrations may change, the commitment to equity *must* remain steadfast. "The work of equity isn't tied to any one political moment—it's about shaping the long game and ensuring our voices are heard regardless of who's in office," she stated. She encouraged the development of strategic case-making skills to effectively communicate the importance of equity initiatives to diverse audiences, ensuring sustained support and progress regardless of political climates.

Inspiring Peers and Communities

A key takeaway from the conversation was the role of leaders in inspiring both peers and communities. "Leadership in equity work is not just about guiding others—it's about lifting them up," Dr. Manuel shared. By sharing successes, acknowledging challenges and celebrating collective achievements, leaders can motivate others to engage deeply and persistently in the pursuit of justice. She urged attendees to "build on each other's strengths and create space for new voices to emerge."

Building on Themes from the 2024 Symposium

This discussion built upon themes from the 2024 Colorado Health Symposium, where Dr. Manuel addressed the transformative power of narratives in advancing equity and justice. She highlighted the necessity of reclaiming and reshaping narratives to reflect the diverse experiences of communities, thereby influencing public perception and policy. "We don't just need better stories—we need a better way of getting people to hear them," she stressed. The Symposium served as a catalyst for ongoing conversations about the strategic use of storytelling in health equity work.
