Foundation Announces LEED/WELL Gold Certifications



Last week, the Foundation, <u>Davis Partnership Architects</u>, <u>Saunders Construction</u> and <u>WSP</u> announced that the Foundation's office building in Denver's Uptown neighborhood has been awarded WELL Certification at the Gold level by the International <u>WELL Building Institute™</u>. The project has also achieved <u>LEED</u> v4 Gold Certification by the <u>U.S. Green Building Council</u>. The building is the first project in the nation to be both WELL Certified™ Gold and <u>LEED v4</u> Gold Certified, reflecting the Foundation's commitment to improve the health of all Coloradans, including employees and visitors.


Foundation Chief Financial and Administrative Officer Rahn Porter said, "Our decision to construct a new home office was driven by our

The Foundation Partners with KaBOOM! to Create Safe and Equitable Playgrounds



A safe place to play is vital to physical, creative, cognitive, social and emotional development for all youth. The Foundation and KaBOOM! are working with communities where we have a Iocal focus to design and build state-of-the-art playgrounds to help bring health in reach.

In early May, KaBOOM! led a visioning exercise with kids and community members from Alamosa and Eagle counties to design their dream playground. Working together with their peers and neighbors, each community agreed upon a playground blueprint that would best meet the unique recreational needs of their city.

In the city of Alamosa, the Lee Field Athletic Complex is already a recreational hub for community members. On June 30, it will become home to a new, resident-designed playground. <u>Learn more and register</u> to participate as a volunteer at the KaBOOM! build day in **Alamosa**.
